HEADTEACHER'S MESSAGE TO ALL

Dear Parent/Carer,

As I come to the end of my first academic year in charge, I would like to take a moment to reflect. I can honestly say it's a privilege and an honour to be Headteacher of Hednesford Valley High School. Since taking over in September, I took my first term to settle in and access the current situation of our school. What I witnessed were happy students with a zest for learning and staff passionate about teaching and supporting young people. I also took time to listen to the voice of all stakeholders, including you, our parents and carers. Your advice then and throughout the year has been pivotal in allowing me to fully recognise where we are and our potential for the future. From feedback and from observation it is clear; we all want Hednesford Valley High to become a school where students love to learn and staff love to teach and support young people.

We are getting there. We have made several appointments and changes during the year to enhance the teaching and support of our students, including:

- Increasing the staff and further developing the provisions and facilities at Hednesford Valley Sixth Form (based at Cannock Chase High School).
- Appointing an Educational Welfare Officer to support students and families with attendance issues.
- Appointing a trained Counsellor to support students who are struggling with mental health.
- Developing links with outside venues, including Gartmore Riding School, South Staffordshire College and Cannock Leisure Centre to enhance the provisions for our students.
- Starting the process with Staffordshire Virtual School and ARC to become an Attachment Aware and Trauma Informed School.
- Beginning our journey to become an Anti-Bullying School. We now have several trained Anti-Bullying Ambassadors in school, to support our drive.
- Joining a national programme with Whole School SEND to develop practices with other schools from across the country.
- Establishing a Parent/Carer Forum to further improve communication with parents and carers.

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This is having immediate impact. Our attendance is **well above** the national average for Special Schools and maintained Secondary Schools. It is not just attendance that has seen improvement. Our behaviour rates for students are also better than the national average for Special and Mainstream Secondary Schools. From the hard work of our Sixth Form staff, we have also seen a doubling of students registered to attend Hednesford Valley Sixth Form in September.

Although I am proud of the success of students and staff this academic year, I appreciate more is to be done and I look forward to providing an opportunity of sharing my vision for the future with you all. On **Thursday 28**th **September 2023** I will be hosting two events where I will share my three-year School Improvement Plan. To support parents and carers, one will be during the school day and one in the evening. More details are to follow in September. Finally, Mrs Hopewell our Deputy Headteacher, has been appointed Headteacher at a Special Primary School in Sandwell. Mrs Hopewell has been at the forefront of Hednesford Valley High over the years and I would personally like to thank her for the support she has provided this academic year. We wish her well in her new role.

That brings me to the end. I wish all staff, students and their families a well-earned break and an opportunity to recharge the batteries before seeing everyone back in on Tuesday 5^{th} September.

A massive thank you must go to Mr Willett who organised the event. Everything ran smoothly and students even had the opportunity to have a well-earned ice cream before heading off for their Summer Holidays.

RHU SWIMMING LESSONS

This half term, tutor group RHu have taken part in regular swimming lessons. Students have shown an increased confidence within the water and all engaged with the sessions wonderfully.

Most notably one student who had little experience swimming is now able to go under the water and through a weighted hula hoop! She has shown a huge increase in her confidence and skills within the water

As a class team we are all incredibly proud of how tutor group RHu represented the school whilst out in the community.

HORSE RIDING

During the current academic year we have had a total of 23 students attend Gartmore Riding School for weekly horse-riding sessions. All students have thoroughly enjoyed their sessions, their confidence grew each week and every single student was disappointed when their course came to an end.

One student who was very anxious about going declined their place initially. After explaining to the student how they would get to meet the horses and that it was ok if they did not feel comfortable getting on a horse, he then agreed to attend. His confidence grew every session and to this day, he still asks if he can go back to Gartmore.

Some of our students were 'natural riders' despite only sitting on a horse once, many years ago; these students were totally at ease with their horse.

More recently we had a student whom for the first few sessions had felt he was unable to sit on his horse and instead spent time getting to know 'Barney'. Over the course of time, he was able to not only sit on his horse but was able to ride for the full session and he completely enjoyed it.

We have had extremely positive feedback from one of the parents of a recent student on the course, who said that "Gartmore has been the best thing that her daughter has ever been involved with, she has absolutely loved it."

One of our students from the first course was asked to come back and support our students whom were on the next course. This student progressed well and was awarded a certificate of recognition from the Riding for the Disabled Association (RDA) for 'Contributing Over and Above'.

Sixth Form have had a very busy term and we are very proud of their contributions and achievements.

In addition, Sixth Form took part in a creative arts project delivered in collaboration with Cannock Chase Educational Partnership. This consisted of several 'masterclasses' including environmental awareness, film/video skills and presentation skills. EATING OUT DURING THE SUMMER HOLIDAYS

We have put together a list of places where children can eat for free or at a reduced rate during the Summer holidays.

ASDA - Kids eat for £1 every day until the end of the year at Asda cafes, with no adult spend required.

TESCO - Kids eat free in Tesco cafes when an adult spends as little as 60p and scans their Clubcard. This deal starts from July 24 and finishes September 1 in England and Wales.

SAINSBURY'S - Kids eat for free at Sainsbury's cafes with the purchase of an adult hot main meal costing £5.20 or more. This is available from 11.30am until September 3 - after this, kids can eat for £1.

MORRISONS - Kids eat free, all day, every day when an adult purchase a main meal for £4.49 or more.

BEEFEATER / BREWERS FAYRE - Two kids under 16 can get a free breakfast every day with one paying adult during the summer holidays. An adult breakfast costs £9.99 and is served until 10.30am every day.

HUNGRY HORSE - Two kids eat for £1 on Mondays at Hungry Horse restaurants with every full paying adult

FARMHOUSE INN - Two kids eat for free per paying adult Monday to Friday at Farmhouse Inns from July 24 until September 8.

TRAVELODGE - Two children eat breakfast for free at Travelodge when one adult buys a full priced breakfast. Breakfast is normally served every morning between 7am at 10am on weekdays, and between 8am and 11am during weekends and bank holidays.

PREMIER INN - Two kids eat breakfast for free when one adult buys a full breakfast. Breakfast is normally served every morning from 6:30am until 10:30am on weekdays and from 7am until 11am during weekends and bank holidays.

SIZZLING PUBS - Kids can eat for just £1, every Monday to Friday, 3pm until 7pm, when an adult purchases a main meal.

IKEA - Kids get a meal from 95p daily from 11am. Excludes IKEA Hammersmith and order and collection points.

BELLA ITALIA - Kids eat for £1 with any adult main. The offer is valid from 4pm until 6pm, Monday to Thursday.

WHITBREAD INNS - Two kids under 16 eat for free with every adult breakfast purchased.

DUNELM - Kids get one mini main, two snacks and a drink free in Dunelm Pausa Coffee shops with every £4 spent after 3pm.

YO! SUSHI - Kids eat free with every £10 adult spend from July 17 until August 11.
